The day will also include a pediatric toxicology patient simulation session hosted by the Alberta Children's Hospital KidSim program, one of PADIS' partners.

In addition, PADIS is hosting an Open House from 1-5pm on Friday, November 4th. Come meet the staff, join them for their "Question of the Week" educational rounds from 2-3pm, and enjoy refreshments.
